

ABOUT THE CIRCLE - FIRST NATIONS ENTREPRENEUR HUB

The Circle is funded by the National Indigenous Australians Agency, in partnership with the South Australian and Australian Governments. The Circle supports First Nations businesses and entrepreneurs to start, sustain and grow their business by connecting to new and existing business support services; building business-to-business relationships and networks; and facilitating access to new market opportunities.



The Circle was officially launched in August 2021, and currently has a membership base of more than 260 First Nations owned businesses in South Australia.

As well as directly supporting First Nations businesses, The Circle offers a single point of contact to connect industry, the private sector and Government to members to match procurement opportunities and build sustainable relationships.



THE FIRST NATIONS BUSINESS SHOWCASE (SA)

This annual event, held during Indigenous Business Month, demonstrates and celebrates the strength and diversity of the First Nations business sector in South Australia. Bringing together the largest gathering of First Nations businesses in the state under one roof, guests will witness the abundant opportunities to engage, purchase from and partner with this flourishing sector. With more than 130 businesses exhibiting in 2023, The First Nations business Showcase (SA) is an event not to be missed!



INDIGENOUS BUSINESS MONTH

Indigenous Business Month aims to ignite conversations about Indigenous business and encourage and foster relationships and connections. This year's theme, 'To gather, together', acknowledges that gathering is at the heart of building relationships. Strengthening the First Nations business sector requires place-based gatherings to expand and build strong relationships. This is at the heart of the First Nations Business Showcase (SA).



National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA)

The Australian Government has delivered the Indigenous Business and Employment Hubs program since 2018. The Circle, opened in 2021, followed the opening of Yarpa Hub in Sydney in 2018 and Waalitj Hub in Perth in 2020. The Hubs network also includes the Northern Territory Indigenous Business and Employment Hub opened in 2023. The Hubs program, including The Circle, responds to a call for better business support identified through successive consultations and co-design processes with First Nations business people and leaders.

The Australian Government funds a range of other initiatives that provide targeted support to First Nations people who are seeking to start up or develop businesses. This includes the Business Solutions Program (BSP) delivered through Indigenous Business Australia and the Microenterprise Development program (MED) and Community Development Program (CED) delivered through Many Rivers. The Australian Government also helps to drive demand for First Nations businesses' goods and services through the Indigenous Procurement Policy (IPP) which seeks to increase the proportion of Commonwealth Government contracts that are secured by First Nations enterprises. Since the implementation of the IPP in 2015, First Nations businesses have secured over \$9 billion in Australian Government contracts. First Nations tourism business owners can access tailored, place based, mentoring support through the Australian Government's First Nations Tourism Mentoring Program.




